MUSIC MINISTRY Today's scripture tells the story about the wedding feast at Cana. We don't hear of any reference to music that day but weddings, in all cultures and times, are usually filled with music to celebrate. The Church values singing together because the liturgy is meant to express the unity of all the people gathered. Group singing says that each of us is necessary and we're all in this together. It's the difference between singing "Happy Birthday" or "the National Anthem" just by a soloist or by everyone together. Singing together shows and strengthens the unity of the gathered and is strongly encouraged at catholic weddings for this beautiful reason.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION Topic this Sunday (Jan. 17) is "The Eucharist—Source and Summit of Christian Life." The Eucharist is called the Real Presence of Jesus. But many Catholics struggle to understand and explain what this means. 


