A PILGRIM PEOPLE: THE STORY OF OUR CHURCH At this very important session, **Sunday, Feb. 12**, Fr. A cantor is both a singer and a leader of congregational singing, encouraging the assembly's voice to full, conscious and active participation. Sometimes, such as here at Precious Blood, a music minister may serve in all three roles.


SEPARATED?DIVORCED? WIDOWED?


