There is a lot of excitement in the Culpeper community about everything that Epiphany Catholic School has to offer. 
At my principal's meeting last Monday, our 2016-17 school year enrollment review showed an increase of 37% in three years. Since the 2013/2014 year, our K-8 enrollment has nearly doubled, from 84 students to 152! Currently 70% of our enrollment comes from the 22701 zip code. However, this year we have seen increases in zip codes 22735, 22712, and 22727 of 2.5%. We are excited that families outside the

Culpeper area are now enrolling at our school for next year.

I am proud to say that, according to the Office of Catholic Schools' data, out of the 21 schools that increased enrollment, Epiphany has the highest percentage in added student population for the second year! **Great things really are happening here!** Please call our school office for registration information and to tour our facility.
