Dear Parishioners,

This Wednesday, March 1, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent for us in the Latin Rite. The ashes that we receive are a sign of our penitence, as well as a reminder of our fragility and the fleetingness of our life. The Church provides two options of what can be said when the ashes are given, both allusions to Scripture. We can say, either, "Remember, you are dust and to dust you will return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel." It is a day of universal fast and abstinence (from meat) in the Church.

We observe 40 days of prayer and penance from the First Sunday of Lent till Holy Thursday. This was originally a time for the Catechumens (those preparing for Baptism) to intensify their preparation to receive the gift of new life from the waters of Baptism. As time went on, it became a period for all of the baptized also to pray for those Catechumens preparing for this most important day of their lives, as well as an opportunity for the already baptized to deepen in their own conversion through prayer and penance.

I would like to encourage all of you to attend Mass daily, if possible, during this time. We will be adding an additional Mass in the evening to make this possible, on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 7 PM, in addition to our 7 PM Mass on Fridays. If you cannot attend daily Mass, I would encourage you to read the daily Scripture readings assigned to each Mass. They are especially rich and can be found in our Sunday bulletin or also online.

Please also pray for those of our parish who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil, the most important Liturgy of the entire year. Pray also for some of our brothers and sisters who are already baptized, but who are preparing to be received in to full Communion with the Church through the reception of Confirmation and the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 15, at 8:30 PM.

I would like to thank the parishioner who donated \$150 to help defray the cost of the bus that we used to go to the March for Life and also another parishioner who donated \$500 to help defray the cost of the renovation of the Cry Room. We are still in the process of looking at possibilities to see how we can renovate it.

And thank you also to all of those who have brought food by the rectory; your kindness is greatly appreciated.

One of these funds is the Diocesan Scholarship Foundation that provides assistance to low income, new students enrolling at Diocesan Catholic Schools. Families remain eligible as long as they do not exceed the income level mandated by the program guidelines.
