MUSIC MINISTRY: Gregorian chant: part 2. In the mid-8th century, the Frankish kingdom of Pepin the Short adopted the Roman liturgy. Roman cantors crossed the Alps and spread the chant, resulting in a successful fusion of Roman and Gallican chants. With Charlemagne and the crucial role of monasteries in spreading chant throughout Western Christendom, what was now known as Gregorian chant really took off. During the 10th century, this extended repertoire was transcribed onto manuscripts using various musical notations. Lined staves, which were gradually introduced in the 11th century, helped achieve more accurate transmission of the melodies. (www.solesmes.com/history)

Dear Parishioners,

Bishop Burbidge's office sent us this notice:

As a general rule, the obligation of abstinence from meat on Fridays of Lent is an important element of the Church's observance of the penitential nature of this holy season.

This year, however, Friday of the second week of Lent corresponds with Saint Patrick's Day (March 17), which has traditionally been an occasion for joy-filled celebrations in this diocese. Having taken into consideration both past practice and present circumstances, and having judged that it would serve the spiritual good of the faithful, Bishop Burbidge has granted to the faithful of the Diocese of Arlington, as well as to any visitors or travelers who may be physically present within the territory of this diocese, a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on March 17, 2017.

Those taking advantage of the dispensation, however, are exhorted to undertake a work of charity, an exercise of piety, or an act of comparable penance on some other occasion during the Second Week of Lent.

For Lent I'd like to encourage you to attend daily Mass. In addition to our usual Mass at 8:30 AM, seven days a week, we are adding a 7 PM Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, as well as our usual 7 PM Mass on Friday.

We continue to pray the Stations of the Cross at 6:30 PM in English (before the Mass) and at 7:30 PM in Spanish (right after the Mass). There will be a baked-fish dinner in the parish hall from 5 PM to 6:15 PM. (Please try to finish eating by 6:25 PM if you would like to receive Communion at the 7 PM Mass, in order to observe the one-hour fast before receiving Communion.)

I would like to ask you to offer your prayer, fasting and almsgiving this Lent for those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith, so that they will return some day.

I'd like to thank those who have pledged to the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. Our assigned goal is \$120,000, and parishioners have pledged \$28,125, so far, or 23% of our goal. I would like to encourage anyone who has not given or made a pledge yet to consider doing so.

And, as always, thank you also to all of those who have brought food by the rectory; your kindness is greatly appreciated.


