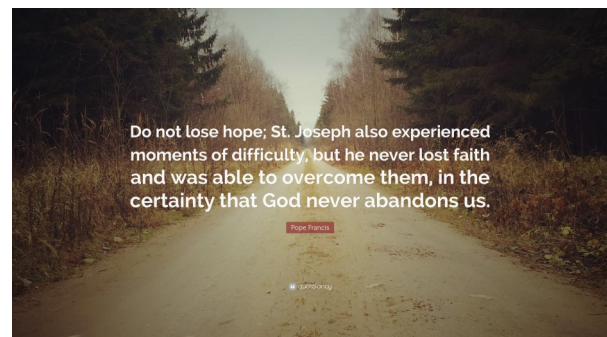

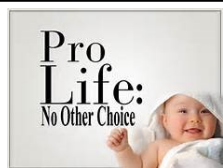

Dear Parishioners,

During the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, we are observing the First, Second and Third Scrutinies at the 11:30 AM Mass for the catechumens of our parish who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. Since I am celebrating the Scrutinies with them, I will not be at the 8:30 AM Masses during those weeks. We will also be adding a 10 AM Mass (in English) and a 4 PM Mass (in Spanish) on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday to accommodate all those who want to attend, so we will also have a different schedule for the priests those days. I look forward to getting back to our normal rotation after Easter.

For Lent I'd like to encourage you to attend daily Mass and to pray the Stations of the Cross (Via Crucis) with us. We have the Stations of the Cross at 6:30 PM in English (before the 7 PM Mass) and at 7:30 PM in Spanish (right after the Mass). There is also a baked-fish dinner in the parish hall from 5:00 PM to 6:15 PM. I would like to ask you to offer your prayer, fasting and almsgiving this Lent for those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith, so that they will return some day.

I'd like to thank those who have pledged to the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. Our assigned goal is \$120,000, and parishioners have pledged \$115,960, so far, or 97% of our goal. Thank you for having helped us almost reach our goal.

Thank you also to all of those who have brought food by the rectory; your kindness is greatly appreciated.

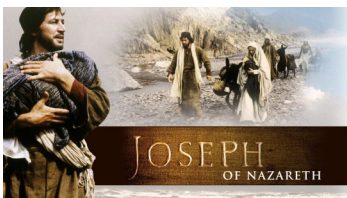
