

~CORPUS CHRISTI~

The feast of Corpus Christi developed in the Middle Ages partly out of popular devotion to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and partly as a response to various heresies which denied the Real Presence of Christ in the consecrated bread and wine.

To begin this Mass we acknowledge the times when we've been casual or indifferent to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We ask God to deepen our appreciation of this gift to us and help us to respond to the grace that's offered to us in the sacrament of the Eucharist.

In the Mass and in Holy Communion, Christ offers himself to us as someone we can return to again and again, so as to take him into ourselves and be nourished by him.

If we approach the Eucharist with a materialistic mentality we fail to understand and so lose the benefits of such a wonderful gift of God's love. The Eucharist is true food and drink but at the same time it is very different from every other food and drink. The great difference lies in these words of Christ which St Augustine heard in prayer, "You will not change me into yourself as you would food of your flesh; but you will be changed into me." We transform ordinary food into our own bodies but the food of the Eucharist transforms us into the body of Christ. Ludwig Feuerbach's statement that we become what we eat is never truer than in the Eucharistic experience.

Let us today approach the Eucharist with a more lively faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and we shall experience therein God's saving power and transforming love.

Corpus Christi means three things to us.

First, it reminds us of who it is that we are receiving and what we are doing when we approach the Eucharist.

Second, it gives us the chance to be grateful to the Lord, for so great a wondrous gift.

Thirdly, we all want fellowship very much. Corpus Christi reminds us that we ought to look at the Lord together. It is He who has the power to unite us into one. It is like the Tower of Babel overturned or reversed. Then, the people wanted to go to God and they believed in their own strength. But, here we realize that unity is not our gift to God but rather unity is God's gift to us and if we want unity, we need to look at the Lord.
