Pope Francis: Dear young people, do not be mediocre; the Christian life challenges us with great ideals.

DON'T CAST YOUR PEALS BEFORE SWINE!

Christians have God-given obligations to preach and teach the truth and to help those in need. We are told to be good neighbors, and this is illustrated in the parable of "The Good Samaritan" by a willingness to become involved. We must not take these responsibilities lightly.

But, as is usually the case, there is another side to our responsibilities as servants. Sometimes Christians, in their eagerness to be compassionate and Christ-like, fail to recognize that God put limitations on this aspect of our discipleship. It is not always good stewardship to expend the time and energy to teach the truth or to render assistance to those apparently in need of such. In fact, sometimes to do so is poor stewardship and betrays our Lord's trust in us. While we do not want this fact to be used as an excuse to ignore our responsibilities to act, neither do we want to waste the things the Lord has entrusted to us, including our lives and ourselves.

Pearls

Pearls are formed by an injury to an oyster, something foreign and hurtful has entered into the oyster and the oyster has produced a pearl through the suffering they have endured from the foreign invader....

I believe the foreign invader is sin. The sin that invades us as believers is foreign to us, it is harmful to us, but God uses it to bring about God's character in us. The sin that besets us is turned around for our good. We suffer if sin is working it's spiny fangs into us, but we persevere in fighting sin secreting the juices of the Holy Spirit in us fighting the sin and resulting in victory over it resulting in a pearl for God's glory.

We minister out of our own deliverance. When we are delivered from a sin then we

have something to share! We become a minister in the area we have been delivered from.

Now Jesus says don't cast your pearls before swine....The context is ministering to a Christian who has a sin in their lives and not judging them without first considering yourself. So if the context is Christian with Christian then the only answer to this is a "professing Christian" who is in sin but unrepentant, is not worthy of your ministering with the pearl produced from your suffering and healing by the Lord because that would take humility from the receiver. If a person is not also fighting sin in their lives and is not humbly seeking God for deliverance then they cannot receive your pearls and they will also detest your pearls because your pearls will convict them of their sin in such a way that they harden their hearts even more and will hate you for pointing things out and will attack you in your most vulnerable place if you open that place to them.

So Jesus is warning us to deal with the sin in our own lives and if we have deliverance in an area then we have a ministry to share with those who also are seeking deliverance but as a kindness Jesus is also protecting us from the attack of the Enemy in those who are not repentant that we should not put ourselves out there to be skewered! Also Jesus says judge not that you not be judged....If we go to confront someone else of their sin and have not dealt with the sin in our own lives then the person we are seeking to confront will turn around and confront us with our own sin and no one will benefit!!! You will be attacked and the person you sought out will not be ministered to at all! And you will be found to be a hypocrite!
