Pope Francis: "Let us ask the Lord for the grace not to speak badly of others, not to criticize, not to gossip, but rather to love everyone."

Pope Francis' Discourse at Vigil of Prayer for the Synod on the Family

Good evening! The evening is now descending on our assembly. It is the hour in which one gladly returns home to meet at the same table, in the warmth of affections, of the good done and received, of meetings that warm the heart and make it grow, good wine that anticipates in man's days the celebration without end.

It is also the heaviest hour for one who finds himself face to face with his loneliness, in the bitter twilight of broken dreams and plans: how many persons drag their days in the blind alley of resignation, of abandonment, if not of rancor; in how many homes the wine of joy has failed and, therefore, the flavour – the wisdom itself – of life ... Of these and others we make ourselves voice with our prayer.

It is significant how – also in the individualist culture that distorts and renders bonds ephemeral — in every man born of woman there remains alive an essential need of stability, of an open door, of someone with whom to plan and share the story of life, a story to which one belongs.

The communion of life assumed by spouses, their openness to the gift of life, their mutual protection, the meeting and memory of the generations, the educational support, the transmission of the Christian faith to children ... in all this the family continues to be the school of humanity without equal, indispensable contribution to a just and solidaristic society (cf. Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, 66-68). And the more profound their roots are, the more possible it is in life to go out and to go far, without getting lost or feeling foreign in some land. This horizon helps us to appreciate the importance of the Synodal Assembly.

Family is important to everyone, or at least ought to important to everyone. When I read this opening paragraph I thought of all the wounded families that I have encountered as a priest. Parents who wonder why their children have left the faith. About couples trying to make sense of a 25 year marriage that ended in divorce. The pain of couples who are unable to have children. Families that have the scars of physical, sexual and emotional abuse. One author said, "we choice our friends God choices our family." We are called to love our families first. We don't need to go into the city to discover the world. The joys, sorrows, and pains of the world are in our own families. It is in our families that we first learn how to love.

There is great hope. Jesus looks with love at our wounded families. His grace, love and mercy are meant to shine in the darkness.
