

Christ is risen!Χριστός ἀνέστη!Truly, He is risen!Ἀληθῶς ἀνέστη!

This was the greeting in the early Church (as the above phrases in Greek indicate) during the entire 50 days of the Easter season until Pentecost Sunday. It is still used in some parts of the world today, especially in eastern Europe (and Greece). You'll hear me use it from time to time during the Mass as well.


After preparing throughout Lent to celebrate the Paschal Mystery (the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ), we now have a week of weeks (50 days) to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

As I write this, we are expecting 15 Elect from our parish (the Catechumens) to receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. As newly baptized, we now call them the "Neophytes" (which means the "newly planted ones" in Greek). Beginning with Easter/Resurrection Sunday, the Neophytes embark on a stage of their formation called the Mystagogia. This word from Greek means the time of being "led into the Mysteries". The word "Mystery" in the early Church was the first word used for the Sacraments. From now until Pentecost Sunday (May 20th this year), they will be formed in a deeper understanding and appreciation of the sacraments they have received. There will be an echo of the great Easter Vigil on the evening of May 19th when we have the (shorter) Pentecost Vigil and begin to close the Easter season. The recently baptized will have the right to wear their baptismal garments to the Pentecost Vigil and are encouraged to do so. We will continue to pray for them throughout the Easter season.

The Diocese is offering a seminar for those who would like to serve in their parishes as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. If you would like to serve in this capacity, please let us know at the Rectory office.
