

MASS FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION Tomorrow, Monday August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption. There will be Mass at both 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year.



Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

On Monday, August 15, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. It is a holy day in the Church, although this year, because it falls on a Monday, the obligation of attending Mass is lifted. Still, if you can attend Mass on that day, I think it would be a beautiful way to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will be adding a 7 PM Mass in addition to the regular 8:30 AM Mass to make it easier to do that.

I would like to thank all of those who have brought food and drink by this last week, including Gerry Culver, Mary Ann Revai, Betty and Dave Craven, and a couple who wanted to remain anonymous; thank you all for your kindness.

We are beginning to pray the Liturgy of the Hours with anyone who would like to, after the 8:30 AM Mass, Mondays through Saturdays. Specifically we will pray Morning Prayer, also known as Lauds. The Liturgy of the Hours is the official Liturgy of the Church, along with the Sacraments (especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation). All Catholics should know what the Liturgy of the Hours is, and how to pray it, since it "ranks above", so to speak, any other non-liturgical prayers, such as the Rosary, the chaplet of Divine Mercy or the Stations of the Cross (just to name a few). I am always surprised at how so many life-long Catholics have never heard of the Liturgy of the Hours, or think it is only for priests and nuns, or who do not know how to pray it.

The Liturgy of the Hours developed in the early Church as a way of sanctifying the whole day, and is based on the Psalms, especially, spread over a cycle of four weeks. It is the book of prayer for all Catholic Christians, and we are encouraged to pray it together in groups. If you are interested in learning how to pray it, please join us after the daily morning Masses.

Our diocese is offering us membership in an online, audio and video platform which offers various programs of formation in the Catholic faith. (Someone has referred to it as a "Catholic Netflix", though I think it is primarily educational, rather than focused on entertainment.) It includes resources from the Augustine Institute, Word on Fire, Ignatius Press and other groups. More information can be found at www.formed.org. The diocese is subsidizing half of the subscription cost. Still, an annual membership (giving every parishioner access to video series, electronic books, audio talks and movies) would cost \$770. At this point we have already formed our budget, and that would put us in to a deficit. But I thought I would mention this program, in case anyone would like to sponsor it (or a part of it) at our parish.

Finally, I would like to have a weekend dedicated to learning about various groups in our parish, and offering the opportunity to join a group. I have done this in other parishes and called it Ministry Sunday. We will offer it the weekend of October 8 and 9. I hope we will have all parish groups that would like to participate to set up a table after the Sunday Masses to let parishioners know who they are and what they do. I'd like that to include Ushers, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Choirs, Altar Servers, the Altar Society and the Knights of Columbus. If there are any groups that would like to participate, please contact the rectory office so we can have a table set up for you. This would be an opportunity to welcome new members to your ministry or group. I am also hoping to have a Sacristan at every Sunday Mass who will help set up for the Mass. If you are willing to serve in this capacity at a certain Mass time, please call the rectory. If we could get two people for each Mass time, we could alternate Sundays.
