MUSIC MINISTRY Our gathering hymn today, ALL THE ENDS OF THE EARTH (Ps. 98), was composed in 1981 by Father Bob Dufford, a Jesuit priest who was an original member of the "St. Louis Jesuits", a group of Catholic composers in the 1970s & 1980s who used texts from Scripture and other religious sources combined with acoustic instruments, beautiful melodies and dynamic rhythms to help bring the Word to new generations. He also composed many other beloved Catholic scripture-based hymns such as "Be Not Afraid" (Isaiah 43, Luke 6), "Like a Shepherd" (Isaiah 40, Ezekiel 34 & Matthew 11) and "Sing to the Mountains" (Ps. 118 & Isaiah 6).


