Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Friday, January 19, 2018, is the date of the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. Our parish was blessed last year with 80 people (a record for us) who wanted to go. Since we had rented one bus that held 55, we couldn't accommodate them all. This year we would like to offer two buses, but we need to have a coordinator. Those who have coordinated in the past are not able to do so this year. If you are willing to coordinate this (with help from our staff), please contact the rectory office as soon as possible, since we only have one more month to do so.

During Advent, we have added a 7 PM Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, in addition to the regular Friday 7 PM Mass, to make it easier to come to Mass during this time of preparation to celebrate the birth of our Lord.

We will be installing new carpet in the church this week, so hopefully it will be ready for Christmas Eve. As you may have noticed, as the humidity comes and goes throughout the year, the carpet sometimes "bunches up" which can be a problem if someone is using a walker or walking with a cane. We don't want anyone to trip on the current carpet which is many years old. This has been the motivation for choosing to replace the carpet at this time.

This week, on Thursday, December 21, we will have our Advent Penance Service to prepare for Christmas, at 7 PM. Four priests will be available for Confessions.

With the Fourth Sunday of Advent falling on December 24 this year, we have the grace of attending Mass for Sunday in the morning (or the Saturday Vigil Mass) and for Christmas Eve in the evening (or Christmas Day). (No "twofers" in the Catholic Church.) I encourage you to live out the fullness of both of these liturgical feast days by attending Mass once for each.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.


