Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday, December 3, the First Sunday of Advent, we are celebrating the Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate (for those who are not baptized) as well as the Welcoming of Candidates for Full Communion (for those baptized outside of the Catholic Church and older Catholics who are preparing to receive the Eucharist and/or Confirmation). We will do this at the 11:30 AM Mass in English and at the 2 PM Mass in Spanish. Please pray for those who are preparing to come in to the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil, or are preparing to receive other sacraments.

During Advent we will also add a 7 PM Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, in addition to the regular Friday 7 PM Mass, to make it easier to come to Mass during this time of preparation to celebrate the birth of our Lord.

I have been noticing that more and more people are chewing gum in church. It is good to remember that we cannot give you Communion if you are chewing gum at Mass, since it would be disrespectful to the Eucharist if the gum stuck to the host. But it is also good to reflect that it is not respectful to chew gum during Mass even if we are not going to receive Communion. At times, I have been asked at previous parishes to accompany parishioners to court, and sometimes even to translate for them. I have noticed how strict the decorum is in a court, out of respect for the judge and the law: no gum, no phones, and you're not even supposed to be reading a magazine or a book when someone's case is being discussed! We should realize that we should have at least that much respect when we are in church at Mass; we are in the presence of someone much more important than a human judge: Jesus Christ himself. I would ask you to always dispose of your gum (and lollipops and candy, etc.) before you enter in to church.

Those who are preparing for First Communion and for Confirmation are asked to place their sacramental cards in the basket at the Offertory when they come to Mass. Please remember to print your name and date on the cards, since we have been receiving some blank cards recently, and we don't know who they are from.


