It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent. Fifteen of our parishioners (two adults and 13 youth) will be going to Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton parish in Lake Ridge to participate in the Rite of Election with Bishop Burbidge. In this rite, those who are Catechumens (the unbaptized), who have been preparing to receive the three Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), will be officially chosen (from Latin: "elected") by the Bishop to receive the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. These are members of our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) process or the RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children). After today, the Catechumens will be known as the "Elect" (the chosen).

Also, some of our baptized brothers and sisters (from various Protestant denominations) who are preparing to be received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil (receiving Confirmation and/or Eucharist) will participate in the Call to Continuing Conversion with Bishop Burbidge.

We are blessed in our Diocese to have so many Catechumens and Candidates for Full Communion that we need to have this Rite celebrated twice, in two different venues.

Some parishioners have asked me to write about not receiving Communion from the chalice if a person is sick. Of course, if anyone is aware that they are sick, we would ask you to refrain from receiving from the chalice so as to not spread any germs. If someone also thinks they would spread germs by extending their hands at the Sign of Peace, they may want to bow instead of shaking hands.

Finally, I have had two groups ask me to write about young children who are loud at Mass: families of the young children, and those who are bothered by their loudness. The two groups see things very differently. The families of young children think that the rest of the congregation should be understanding of them, and happy to see them there. Other members of the congregation think that parents of young children who are loud should sit in the Comfort Room, or more promptly remove them from the main body of the church.

I would ask both groups to try to understand the other perspective a little more. If you are bothered by loud children, please remember when you had young children whom you tried to get ready to go to church, and participate at the appropriate times. Reflect on the fact that we are pro-life, and want to support young families as they bring the future of our Church to Mass.

If you have young children who are loud, please try to be considerate of the fact that one loud child could distract most of the rest of the congregation, depriving them of the spiritual nourishment from the Word of God that they have come to receive. Think about the fact that maybe it has been decades since they have been around young children, and are not as used to it as you are.

We would ask everyone to keep the second last pew on both sides of the ground floor free for families with young children (e.g., at least one of the children is under the age of five). Also, we encourage anyone who could benefit from taking advantage of the area behind the glass doors (the vestibule) which lead into our church, and the Comfort Room itself. We renovated this area precisely to make it more "user-friendly" for families with young children.

There is no perfect solution, but we would like to encourage everyone to be charitable to someone who sees the situation differently.

Registration is ongoing at Epiphany School for the next academic year. Please consider this excellent school as a possibility for your children.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.
