
2018 DIOCESAN YOUNG ADULT RETREAT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On Saturday, January 27, one of our parishioners, Michael Watts, received the Ministry of Lector at the Cathedral of Saint Thomas More in Arlington from Bishop Burbidge. This is one more step for him on his path to the permanent diaconate. You will see him sometimes at the Masses in English in an alb (the white robe worn also by priests and deacons which evokes our baptismal garment) when he serves as lector. We'd like to congratulate him and promise him the support of our prayers.

Next weekend we will have the pledge process in the pews for the annual Bishop's Lenten Appeal. I encourage to think this week about what you could commit to this Appeal.

In many parishes, a ministry exists called "The Arimatheans", named after Joseph of Arimathea in the Gospels who lent his burial place for Jesus' burial. Arimatheans are parishioners who help out at funeral Masses in the parish. They may help set up and serve the Mass, and occasionally are asked to do the readings. They are also a big help in cleaning up when the priest has to leave right after Mass for the burial at the cemetery. Often those who serve as Arimatheans are retired or have a work schedule that allows them to help out at a Mass on a weekday or a Saturday. Funeral Masses are usually in the morning at 10 AM or 10:30 AM or sometimes as late as 11 AM. If you are willing to serve in this beautiful ministry, please contact the rectory office.
