Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We were blessed with 93 people (including from neighboring parishes) who went to the March for Life this year. (I unfortunately was not able to go, because I had a funeral Mass and a graveside ceremony.) This is the most people we have ever had attend from our area. I hope we can fill up both buses next year to capacity (110). The total cost of the buses was \$2400, of which we collected \$1103 in donations and the PTO from Epiphany has pledged an additional \$650. This means that donations covered the whole cost, except for \$647; thank you for your generosity.

In many parishes, a ministry exists called "The Arimatheans", named after Joseph of Arimathea in the Gospels who lent his burial place for Jesus' burial. Arimatheans are parishioners who help out at funeral Masses in the parish. They may help set up and serve the Mass, and occasionally are asked to do the readings. They are also a big help in cleaning up when the priest has to leave right after Mass for the burial at the cemetery. Often those who serve as Arimatheans are retired or have a work schedule that allows them to help out at a Mass on a weekday or a Saturday. Funeral Masses are usually in the morning at 10 AM or 10:30 AM or sometimes as late as 11 AM. If you are willing to serve in this beautiful ministry, please contact the rectory office.

Registration has opened up at Epiphany School for the next academic year. Please consider this excellent school as a possibility for your children.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.
