



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Epiphany and Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Monday, January 8. With that feast day, the Christmas season ends and we return to 3. To gain indulgences, whether plenary or partial, it is Ordinary Time in our liturgical calendar.

Friday, January 19, 2018, is the date of the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. Our 4. A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order parish was blessed last year with 80 people (a record for us) who wanted to go. Since we had rented one bus that held 55, we couldn't accommodate them all. This year we will offer two buses. As I write this on January 3, we have 22 people signed up. We will also have about 15 or so coming from Epiphany School, and we might accept another dozen or so people from a local parish that is not sponsoring its own bus. Please sign up this weekend in the church vestibule, or come by or call the church office to sign up. The cost of the two buses will be \$2500 in case anyone would like to help offset this. We plan to leave by 9:30 AM (after the 8:30 AM Mass and Morning Prayer) and return by 6 PM, so please remember to pack a full lunch and drinks.

This year Bishop Burbidge has let us know that the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See (the Vatican) has granted a plenary indulgence, under the "usual conditions", to those who participate in the sacred celebrations carried out on January 18 and 19. What a plenary indulgence is, and the "usual conditions" are explained here:

1. This is how an indulgence is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471): "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".

- 2. In general, the gaining of indulgences requires certain prescribed conditions, and the performance of certain prescribed works
- necessary that the faithful be in the state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.
- to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:
- —have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- —have sacramentally confessed their sins;
- -receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required);
- —pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.
- 5. It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.
- 6. For the sake of those legitimately impeded, confessors can commute both the work prescribed and the conditions required (except, obviously, detachment from even venial sin).
- 7. Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.
