How are hymns chosen for our mass? Working on a whole month's liturgy at a time, preparation begins months before with prayer for guidance, reading through the antiphons and scriptures for the day and consulting several liturgy guides. Consideration is then given to what was sung in previous years on those days, what was sung several months previous, which group/cantor(s) are serving each weekend and what they can do well according to their voice(s)/talent. A draft is written up considering the multiple themes for each liturgy as well as a variety of tempos and styles with extra research and reflection given to find appropriate and relevant meditations. The draft is then set aside for a week or so to give time for further reflection and nudges from the Holy Spirit before making final adjustments and getting the final copies to all of our music ministers.
