



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We had a wonderful visit from Bishop Burbidge at our 11:30 AM Mass last Sunday. Those of you who were there experienced firsthand how gracious he is, and what a gifted speaker he is. Thank you, Bishop Burbidge, for blessing us with your visit.

Today is Palm Sunday. We begin Holy Week. We call this week holy, because it is the last week that Jesus Christ lived on this earth. Please see the schedule of events this week, to see how you might live out your spiritual preparation to celebrate the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord more intensely. In addition to this bulletin, there are schedules available in the vestibule. You can pick up an extra one to pass on to someone else.

The Easter Vigil, on March 31 at 8:30 PM, will be the high point of our entire liturgical year; everyone is invited to attend. We are also adding two additional Masses on Easter (Resurrection) Sunday to accommodate everyone and make it easier to attend. Please note the changed schedule: Masses in English will be at 8:30 PM (Saturday evening) and on Sunday at 8 AM, 10 AM and 12 noon. In Spanish, there will be Masses at 2 PM and 4 PM.

Preparations for WorkCamp to be held this summer are progressing well. There have been a variety of manual labor jobs to help out several parishioners. Generous donors have contributed \$4,525 toward the goal of \$13,000 so that all those who want to participate in WorkCamp can go. Twenty students have registered and they are very excited and appreciative of the opportunities to work to raise funds. The Resurrection of Jesus: Fact or Fiction?

Come to grips with what really happened to Jesus as Dr. Steven Smith explores Resurrection narratives from the vantage point of each of the four Gospels as well as many of the vital medical details of Roman crucifixion.
