I have decided to hire a Director of Faith Formation (DFF) for our parish. The DFF will help me to oversee our adult faith formation programs, including RCIA, as well as our CCD (Religious Education) program.

First, I would like to thank Pat Reed for her faithful service with CCD at Precious Blood. It is my understanding that between volunteering and working as the DRE, she has been involved in CCD at our parish for over 28 years. Thanks, Pat, for all you have done over the years to serve our parish! Pat will continue as Assistant to the DFF.

Steve Hemler will be the DFF. Steve has a Master's degree in Pastoral Studies from Loyola University of Chicago, as well as a Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Civil/Structural Engineering from Virginia Tech. After a 33-year professional engineering career, including 13 years in Saudi Arabia, Steve voluntarily took early retirement in 2011 to follow a calling to serve God and the Church full time. He then founded the Catholic Apologetics Institute of North America (CAINA) and authored *The Reality of God: The Layman's Guide to Scientific Evidence for the Creator*, published by St. Benedict Press & TAN Books. Steve has been actively involved in youth and adult catechesis for over 30 years, including leading our parish's adult faith formation program for the past three years. Steve and his wife, Linda, have been married for 38 years and have three grown children. We welcome Steve to this new position and I ask all of you to give him and all our catechists your encouragement and full support.

Next weekend we will be celebrating Mother's Day in our civil calendar (and the Fifth Sunday of Easter in our liturgical calendar). Being the month of May, dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, we will also be presenting flowers to our heavenly mother, beginning five minutes before the Masses on Saturday evening (Vigil Mass) and on Sunday. Someone asked if those over the age of 18 can do it as well, which I thought was a wonderful idea, so we are opening the presentation of flowers to anyone who would like to do so. Please remember to bring a flower with you if you would like to participate; we might also have a few extra ones on hand.

We will also have envelopes available for anyone who would like to offer a Mass for their mother, whether they are blessed to have them still with them here on this earth, or whether they have returned to the Lord.

There will also be some fundraisers for our youth who will be attending WorkCamp2017; more information about them will be available in the bulletin.

We will have a third celebration of First Communions, this time in Spanish, on Saturday, May 13, at 2 PM. You are all invited to come.

**PLENARY INDULGENCES**: On the 13th of each month, May through October, Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence opportunity for the 100th anniversary of the Fatima apparitions. To obtain the indulgence, visit *with devotion* the statue of Our Lady of Fatima, **which will be near the altar in our Church**, and pray in honor of the Virgin Mary. The faithful must also fulfill the ordinary conditions to obtain a plenary indulgence: **go to confession and Communion**, **be interiorly detached from sin**, **and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father**.



Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471)an indulgence is defined:

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".
