

# Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I received about a dozen comments as feedback regarding the time of the Saturday Vigil Mass. As you can imagine, the opinions were mixed. Some were very much in favor of the change to 5 PM, a couple wanted to retain the time of 6 PM. One person preferred the Mass to start at 4 PM, and someone wanted a Sunday evening Mass to be considered.

Someone rightly pointed out that even by moving the time to 5 PM it still wouldn't be light out by the end of Mass in the darker months of December and January. Looking at our Saturday afternoon schedule with weddings, Quinceañeras and Confessions, we wouldn't be able to have a 4 PM Mass. But by moving the Mass to 5 PM, that will enable more parishioners to attend this Mass (at least 10 months of the year) who find it hard to drive in the dark. Also, though not everyone has dinner at the same time, an earlier Mass will make it easier for most people to have dinner at the most common time.

Taking all this consultation with parishioners during the last two weeks into consideration, I have decided to move up the time by one hour to 5 PM. This will begin on the weekend of the First Sunday of Advent, November 26. Beginning on November 26, we will also adjust the time for Confessions to 3:30 to 4:30 PM.

Next month, on November 15, our parish will be celebrating its 70th anniversary since it was established. The Missionhurst priests (the religious order of the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) played an integral part of our history, serving generously during these 70 years. I would like to honor them, at the 11:30 AM Mass next Sunday, November 13. We are preparing a spiritual bouquet for them. With a spiritual bouquet you can offer up any Masses, rosaries or other prayers that you promise to pray for them; we have a sign-up sheet available for that in the church vestibule, or you can contact the rectory. I would also like to give a donation to the Missionhurst religious order to be used to help take care of their members. If you would like to donate to this fund, please contact the rectory. If you have any memories of their time here (or in neighboring parishes) that you would like to share with them, please send your story by email (preferably typed in a separate Word document) to: office@preciousbloodcatholicchurch.com.
