THE FOUR SOCIAL DOCTRINES OF THE CHURCH:—Thursday, November 16, 2017 from 7-9 pm.

Location: DeSales Hall, Our Lady of Good Counsel, 8601Wolftrap Road, SE Vienna, VA 22182; President and CEO of Catholic Charities Art Bennet will discuss Catholic Social Doctrine. These teachings inspire us to transform lives and encounter Christ

through the 4 principles of human dignity, common good, subsidiarity, and solidarity. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Next Sunday (and after the Saturday Vigil Mass) we will offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all the Masses. The Apostle James says, "Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests (presbyters) of the Church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them." (James 5:14-15) The Gospel of Mark quotes Jesus before his ascension as saying, "... they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover." (Mark 16:18) These are some of the scriptural roots of our sacramental practice. In our Church law, Canon 1004 says that the Anointing of the Sick is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". The General Introduction to the Rite of Anointing says, "Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present." (Paragraph 11) Therefore, anyone who meets these criteria who would like to receive the Sacrament, please wait after Mass and Fr. Mark and I will be administering this beautiful Sacrament.

There will be a World Youth Day with the Pope in Panama in January 2019. The Diocese of Arlington will be sponsoring a pilgrimage to World Youth Day in Panama from January 20-28, 2019. Participants must be between 16 and 35 years of age at the time of the trip (14 or 15 if a parent is a chaperone). The cost is estimated to be around \$2,700 per person, payable in four installments. Our parish is exploring the possibility of participating, but time is very short to organize a group. Initial deposits of \$500 per person must be paid by the end of this month. If you would be interested in joining the pilgrimage, please contact the parish office **THIS WEEK**. Trip details can be found at arlingtondiocese.org/youth-ministry/world-youth-day.

Last Sunday someone pulled two of the fire alarms in the ground level of the church building, where we have CCD classrooms. We would like to ask parents to please keep an eye on their children. If the fire department had been called for a false alarm, this would have been very costly for the parish. This can be a good time to remind everyone where our exits are. We only have the one main entrance and exit as you leave through the glass doors of the church, but since others might be coming down from the balcony in an emergency, there could be a lot of congestion. Please also remember that you can go down the hallway to the right and exit through the doors of the vestibule by the bathrooms. If you are near the front of the church to the left, please consider going out that exit in an emergency, and going down the steps to exit in to the courtyard. If you are in the parish hall due to overflow, you can exit the doors immediately in to the parking lot.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.



superiors assigned him, appointing it a far greater significance to be continued even beyond his earthly life: that of prophet, healer, and intercessor. Known as a wonder-worker and a powerful instrument of divine healing and hope, he touched countless lives. His untiring attention to the sick and poor, combined with his prayers, wise counsel, and burning faith brought an unprecedented outpouring of grief at his death in 1957. More than twenty thousand people attended the funeral of this selfless American-born priest. As a part of his canonization process, the exhumation of his body in 1987 revealed him to be "remarkably intact, and well preserved," seemingly defying corruption. One eyewitness was astonished to see a tiny glimpse of Fr. Solanus' piercing blue eyes again after being buried for thirty years! A gripping story of this priest's simple and unshakable faith in God's goodness unfolds through

interviews with his friends, colleagues, eyewitnesses, biographers, and direct recipients of his healing and prophecy. Rare, never-before-seen film footage and historical photographs are included with actual footage from the exhumation of this exemplary Servant of God.
