HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST FOR NON-DIOCESAN 8TH GRADERS: Eighth grade students attending public schools or non-Catholic private schools who are interested in attending Catholic High Schools in the Diocese of Arlington are required to take the High School Placement Test (HSPT) offered on **Saturday**, **December 2**, **2017 or Saturday**, **January 6**, **2018**. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we will be pointing out all the available exits in the church, which is good to keep in mind in case we ever have an emergency evacuation. In addition to the main doors, there is a side exit on the left of our sanctuary, under the Christ the High Priest crucifix. The stairwell is a little steep, but leads downstairs to an exit that goes in to our courtyard. It would be good if people seated in the first eight pews on the left (or south side of the church) used that exit in case of an emergency.

Those who sit in the balcony on the south side (also called the ambo/pulpit side) could go down two more flights of stairs after getting to the ground floor, and go through the halls of the basement to get to an exit. This would help avoid congestion. Finally, some people could always head past the Cry/Comfort Room in to the foyer by the bathrooms to go out those doors.

Our building clearly was not designed years ago for a quick exit. Our parking situation is also difficult. (If everyone tried to leave in their cars at the same time that emergency vehicles were trying to come in, it would be very problematic.) We are trying to do the best we can with the situation we have. There is a group of parishioners meeting to look at reasonable recommendations for security. Also, at some point in the future, we will try to practice an emergency exit at the end of Mass, when people are leaving. We will ask people in certain areas to exit through specific doors. It might be a little chaotic at first, but it would be good to practice this at least once a year. In any emergency situation we ask that everyone try their very best to remain calm, assist those around you who are younger and older, move with caution to the safety areas, and pray for everyone!

I think that we cannot have smoke detectors in the church since we have incense at weekly exposition and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and sometimes at funerals and other solemn Masses as well. Thanks for your understanding as we try to take reasonable precautions to promote everyone's safety.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.



SOLANUS CASEY: This extraordinary film explores the heroic life of a remarkable, modern-day mystic, Father Solanus Casey, who was relegated to doing little more than being a simple doorman in his monastery. But God would transform the role his superiors assigned him, appointing it a far greater significance to be continued even beyond his earthly life: that of prophet, healer, and intercessor. Known as a wonder-worker and a powerful instrument of divine healing and hope, he touched countless lives. His untiring attention to the sick and poor, combined with his prayers, wise counsel, and burning faith brought an unprecedented outpouring of grief at his death in 1957. More than twenty thousand people attended the funeral of this selfless American-born priest. As a part of his canonization process, (to be beatified on 11/18/17) the exhumation of his body in 1987 revealed him to be



"remarkably intact, and well preserved," seemingly defying corruption. One eyewitness was astonished to see a tiny glimpse of Fr. Solanus' piercing blue eyes again after being buried for thirty years! A gripping story of this priest's simple and unshakable faith in God's goodness unfolds through interviews with his friends, colleagues, eyewitnesses, biographers, and direct recipients of his healing and prophecy. Rare, never-before-seen film footage and historical photographs are included with actual footage from the exhumation of this exemplary Servant of God. *Run Time: 1 hr. 30 mins.*
