



Dear Parishioners,

I would like to thank all of you who prepared and participated in Ministry Sunday two weekends ago. I hope you were able to learn more about our parish and meet other parishioners. We still need more people willing to volunteer as ushers, lectors and sacristans. If you are willing to serve in this capacity, please contact the rectory or someone who works in one of those ministries.

Next month, on November 15, our parish will be celebrating its 70th anniversary since it was established. The Missionhurst priests (the religious order of the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) played an integral part of our history, serving generously during these 70 years. We will be doing the annual Offertory Program that Bishop Loverde asks us to do each year next weekend. Once a year we are asked to look at the gifts we have received, the needs of the parish, and decide what we would like to give to the parish for the upcoming year.
