
SECOND COLLECTION There is a collection this week, October 30th, for those impacted by Hurricane Matthew. Baskets will be in the foyer. One-third of the proceeds will go to Catholic Charities for their efforts in the Southeast, one-third to Catholic Relief Services for their work in Haiti, and one-third to the Diocese of Raleigh to help those affected by flooding in eastern North Carolina. Next week there will be a second collection for the Archdiocese for Military Services U.S.A. Currently, 285 Catholic military chaplains provide pastoral care to over 1.5 million Catholics on ships, in combat, on bases and in 153 VA hospitals. This collection will fund their Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program, which identifies vocations within the military and is now educating 30 men for the priesthood and subsequent military chaplaincy. 
