MUSIC MINISTRY: Instruments in Catholic worship:

The Organ: The Hydraulis, the earliest form of the organ which used wind regulated by water pressure, was created in the 3rd century and originally used at banquets, games, plays, brothels, amphitheaters of the Roman Empire and circuses but not allowed in worship as all instruments were considered secular and not as suitable as the human voice by itself. Around 900 AD organs were slowly introduced into the church and by the 15th century were well established as the "King of Instruments" and "accorded pride of place" because of its capacity to sustain the singing of a large gathered assembly.
