You may have seen the beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima this last week in our sanctuary. This was donated by Ginger Roccapriore in memory of her husband Joe who recently passed away. We have had it in our sanctuary as we approached the 100th anniversary of the last apparition of Our Lady at Fatima, Portugal, on October 13, 1917. Now we will place it back in the niche near the baptismal font as you enter the church.

As I write this, over forty of our young people who are preparing for Confirmation are scheduled to participate in a pre-Confirmation retreat on Saturday, October 14. Please keep them in your prayers as they prepare to receive this final sacrament of Christian Initiation (after having been baptized and received the Eucharist) on May 23, 2018.
