MUSIC MINISTRY: The Guitar. Stringed instruments have been used to help aid the worship and praise of our Lord from the days of the Old Testament where Jubal was the ancestor of all who play harp & flute to the psalms which David played skillfully on his harp to the Book of Revelation where the angels sang and played on God's harps singing before His throne. Even the word "psalm" comes from the Greek "to pluck a string". Throughout the centuries, stringed instruments were gradually reintroduced into communal worship. In Austria during the early 1800s, Father Joseph Mohr wrote "Silent Night" and asked musician-schoolteacher Franz Gruber to add a melody and guitar accompaniment for it so that it could be sung at Midnight Mass. Since then, this has become one of the most beloved guitar hymns sung around the world each Christmas.
