



Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to thank all of those who have brought food by this last week; thank you all for your kindness.

I wanted to let you know that we have given Fr. Leo's chalice to Fr. Anselme as recognition for his four years of service here in our parish. One of our parishioners told me that he recalled having heard Fr. Leo say that he wanted Fr. Anselme to have it.

There were also some other chalices, ciboria, vestments and books that the parish had that we were able to donate to the Missionhurst order to help out various missionary priests. One chalice was sent to Mongolia, to Fr. Pierrot Kasemuana, CICM, the first ordained priest in Mongolia. He also received a few vestments. Another chalice went to Fr. Vidal Luda, CICM, originally from the Philippines, currently a missionary in the barrios of Brazil. We hope that the song books will be able to be used by priests in North Carolina.

After consulting with our Director of Religious Education about returning the time of our first Mass on Sunday to 8:30 AM, it looks like it is possible to have CCD classes begin at 9:45 AM, enabling the parking lots to begin to empty out after 9:30 AM. I have had many parishioners give positive feedback about such a time change. The time of CCD has been moved to 9:45 to 11 AM, which still allows enough time to pick up children before the start of the 11:30 AM Mass. <u>So beginning Sunday, October 2, the first Mass will be at 8:30 AM</u>.
