Hopefully, by the time you read this, our sanctuary will be leveled off. A **big** thank you to Fred Falgiano for his volunteering to oversee the whole project and to all of his volunteer helpers! (I hope we'll have a complete list of everyone by next weekend.) They have been working hard from morning till evening so that we wouldn't be out of our sanctuary for Sunday Mass. As you may already know, October 13th is the 100th anniversary of the final apparition of Our Lady at Fatima, Portugal. During some of the six apparitions that occurred in 1917, Mary asked us to consecrate ourselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. She particularly mentioned consecrating Russia to her Immaculate Heart. Although we can't do that, we can consecrate our parish to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. As your pastor, I would like to ask all of you to do that. I will be doing it in the name of the whole parish the weekend of, October 7th and 8th, at the 5 PM, 11:30 AM and 2 PM Masses; Fr. Mark will do it as my representative at the 8:30 AM Mass. We will ask you to participate by reading some parts together.

By our Baptism, we are all consecrated to the Blessed Trinity. Consecration means to "set aside". We set aside certain things for sacred use, such as churches, chalices and ciboria, vestments, etc. Certain people are also set aside or especially dedicated to God: religious women and men, deacons, priests and bishops. Through a separate consecration, we remember and renew our original consecration in Baptism, and, in this case, dedicate ourselves in a special way to the Mother of God. October 7th is the Feast of the Holy Rosary, the following weekend is October 13th, the anniversary, as well as a preparation for our diocesan pilgrimage on October 14th to the Basilica of the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, our national patroness.

And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.
