

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Happy Labor Day weekend to everyone. With this weekend, we usually think of summer being over, even if the calendar says that the autumn equinox won't be here till September 22 this year.

School began in the public schools a few weeks ago, and it began at Epiphany School this last week. And our Religious Education program ("CCD") will begin next Sunday, September 10. Hopefully everyone has registered their children by now. In case you haven't, please do so by next Sunday, September 10, in order to avoid the late fee. It's interesting to note that CCD means the "Confraternity of Christian Doctrine". This was actually an association established in Rome in 1562. Calling parish religious education "CCD" has disappeared in many parishes, but someone suggested a new meaning could be given to the letters, which would hopefully be more apt: "Creating Christian Disciples". Let's hope that that is what will really happen this year with our young people in our religious education program.

I'd like to thank all of our volunteer catechists who have agreed to impart catechesis to our children in the name of the parents. We provide this service at the parish to help parents in their role educators of their children in everything, but especially in the faith. We realize that as the primary we can never replace the indispensable role of parents in the formation of their children, but we do want to help them in this most important part of their vocation: to transmit faith to their children.

A father came to me last week and asked if we had anything between the classes for First Communion and Confirmation, saying that he would like his child to keep learning. I took the opportunity then, as I do now, to explain that we offer religious education from the Kindergarten level up through the end of high school. And just as in society we provide education for children in secular subjects throughout these years, it is imperative that children learn about God, about their faith and about the meaning of their lives and the purpose of their existence throughout these years as well. All young people should go to religious education classes from the age of Kindergarten through 12th grade. We often offer adult education opportunities as well, since we realize that we all can and need to grow in our faith and can benefit from learning more about it.


And thank you to anyone who has brought food by the rectory this week.
