


Pentecost

Much has been written about the history and importance of Pentecost. Starting with Pope Leo XIII who wrote: "These sublime truths, which so clearly show forth the infinite goodness of the Holy Ghost towards us, certainly demand that we should direct towards Him the highest homage of our love and devotion. Christians may do this most effectually if they will daily strive to know Him, to love Him, and to implore Him more earnestly; for which reason may this our exhortation, flowing spontaneously from a paternal heart, reach their ears. Lastly, we ought to pray to and invoke the Holy Spirit, for each one of us greatly needs His protection and His help. The more a man is deficient in wisdom, weak in strength, borne down with trouble, prone to sin, so ought he the more to fly to Him who is the never-ceasing fount of light, strength, consolation, and holiness. And chiefly that first requisite of man, the forgiveness of sins, must be sought for from Him: "It is the special character of the Holy Ghost that He is the Gift of the Father and the Son. Now the remission of all sins is given by the Holy Ghost as by the Gift of God" Lastly, we ought confidently and continually to beg of Him to illuminate us daily more and more with His light and inflame us with His charity: for, thus inspired with faith and love, we may press onward earnestly towards our eternal reward, since He "is the pledge of our inheritance" (Eph. i. 14)." From **DIVINUM ILLUD MUNUS** Encyclical Pope Leo XIII On Devotion to the Holy Ghost May 9, 1897. Other encyclicals on the Holy Spirit are MYSTICI CORPORIS CHRISTI Encyclical Pope Pius XII On the Mystical Body of Christ June 29, 1943 and continuing with most recently **DOMINUM ET VIVIFICANTEM** Encyclical Pope John Paul II On the Holy Spirit in the Life of the Church and the World May 18, 1986.

Our most recently canonized Saint Mariam Baouardy (St. Mariam of Jesus Crucified) -The Lily of Palestine. (1846-1878) Mariam's devotion to the Holy Spirit was not common in her time. And yet her spiritual journey seemed to be guided by the Spirit in unprecedented ways. Inspired by having received a special prayer to the Holy Spirit during one of her ecstatic experiences, she was convinced that devotion to the Holy Spirit, who was then commonly known as the Paraclete, was needed by the whole Church. She even sent a petition to Pope Pius IX asking him to cultivate a greater devotion within the Church to the Holy Spirit. No one knows what the pope thought of this at the time, but 20 years later Pope Leo XIII published an encyclical about devotion to the Paraclete. - Her two simple prayers, which we can say every day, are:

Holy Spirit, inspire me.
Love of God, consume me.
Along the true road, lead me.
Mary my Mother, look upon me.
With Jesus, bless me.
From all evil, from all illusion,
from all danger, preserve me.
Source of peace, Light,
come and enlighten me.



I am hungry, come and nourish me.

I am thirsty, come and quench my thirst.

I am blind, come and give me light.

I am poor, come and enrich me
